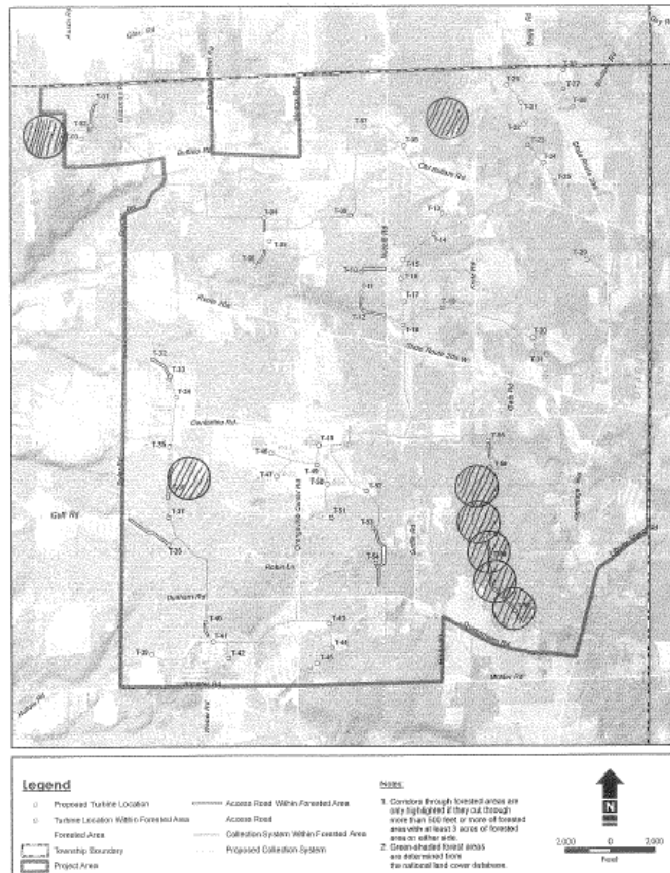

Jefferson Salamanders & Blue Spotted Salamanders sighting

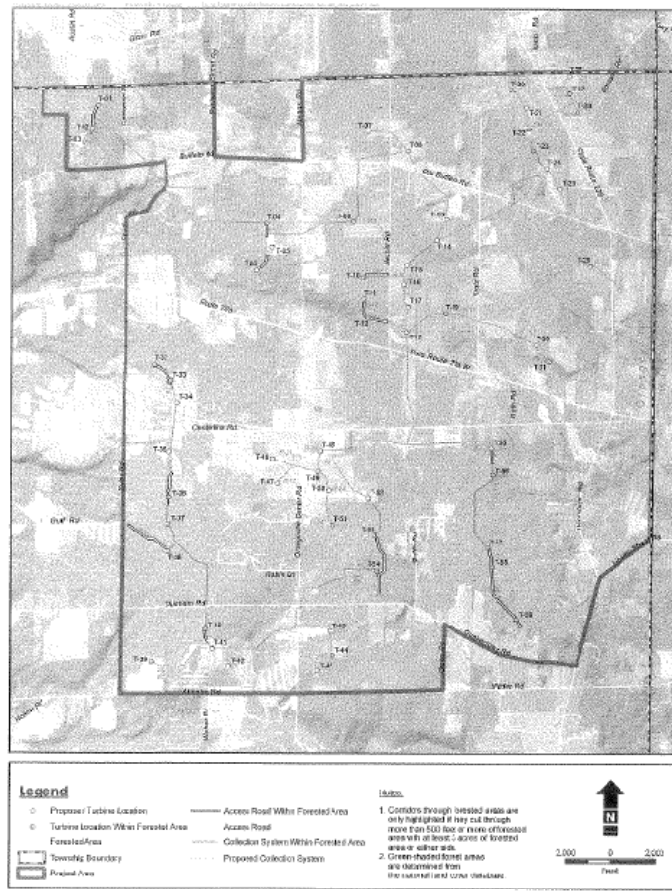

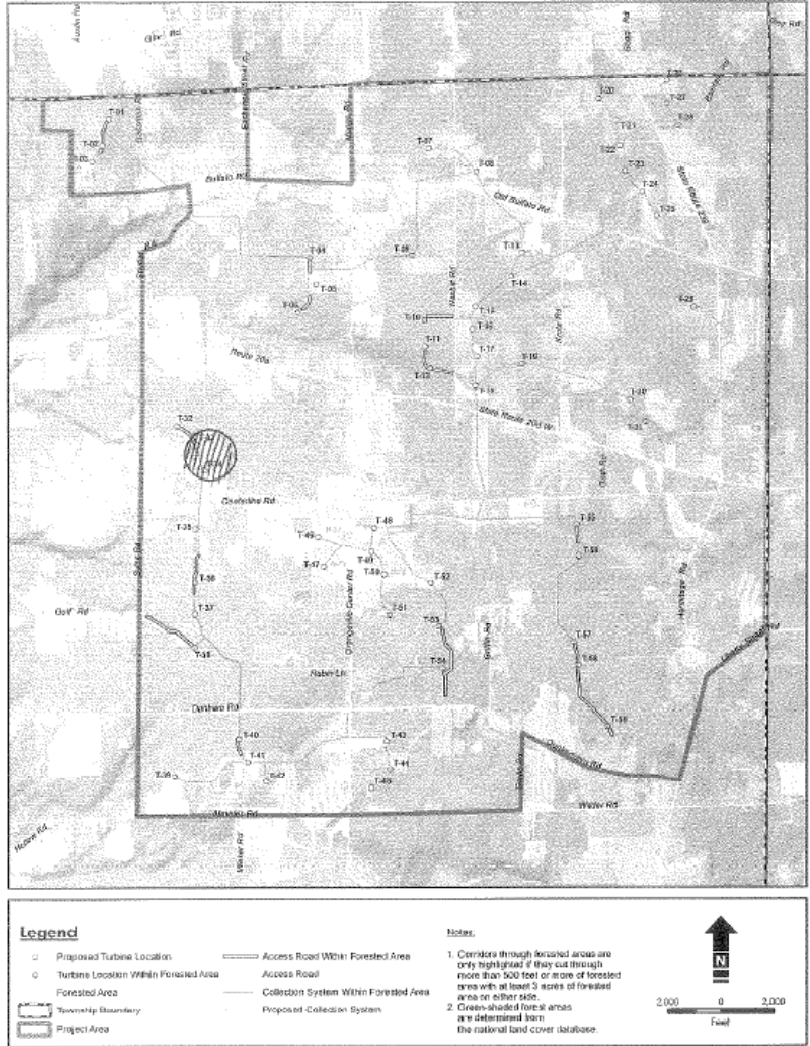
